

Workshop Report

Forest Landscape Restoration

Wanagama, Yogyakarta December 7th – 8th 2009

Introduction

The second workshop on Indonesia Forest Landscape Restoration was conducted in Wanagama, Yogyakarta on 7th to 8th of December 2009. This workshop is a follow up and scaling up workshop of the previous workshop conducted in Batukuru, Bali, Indonesia (12-15 May 2009).

The objectives of the workshop in Wanagama were;

- a. To organize meeting of the National Working Group of Landscape Restoration in Indonesia with wider stakeholders in order to discuss the next activity plan that related with application of forest landscape restoration concept.
- b. Review the Guideline Forest Landscape Restoration for Indonesia developed during the Bali Workshop for inputs and suggestions for wider use and will be submitted to the central government (Ministry of Forestry and Ministry of the Environment) for acceptance and implementation.
- c. Strengthen communication network among managers, academics and private sectors that put their interest and work in landscape restoration. It is including the dissemination of Global Partnership on Landscape Restoration – GPFLR web site.
- d. To identify and extend learning site that related with restoration activity in Indonesia to be connected with *Global Partnership on Landscape Restoration – GPFLR*.

Result of the workshop aimed to provide input for government policies especially for Ministry of Forestry and Ministry of Environment in the framework of restoration of degraded forest and land resources to achieve sustainable development. Furthermore, this workshop also expected to open communication for stakeholders interested for environmental services form forest landscape restoration and to promote welfare and prosperity of local people from landscape restoration activities.

Organization of the Workshop

The workshop was organized collaboratively between Tropenbos International Indonesia Programme (TBI-Indonesia), the Forestry Research and Development of Ministry of Forestry the Republic of Indonesia (FORDA), IUCN, Gajah Mada University and Instiper Yogyakarta. Funding for the workshop was provided by TBI-Indonesia, IUCN, PT. RAPP-APRIL, PT. Rimba Raya Conservation, PT. Adimitra Lestari, PT. Kurnia Sylva Consultindo and in kind contribution from Gajah Mada University and Instiper Yogyakarta.

Agenda of the Workshop

The workshop was conducted for 2 days on December 7th and 8th, 2009. The agenda of the workshop for the first day was preceded with presentation from resource persons on the issue of forest landscape restoration. The second day was mainly working group discussion, to exchange experiences and commitment building for identification of landscape restoration learning sites. The result of the workshop

After two days workshop the following are the main results of the workshop:

1. Participants of the workshop have reviewed the Guideline of Forest Landscape Restoration developed during the first workshop in Bali. In general the guideline is accepted for further development of technical guidelines for implementation.

2. Participants of the workshop have agreed to participate into The Global Partnership on Forest Landscape Restoration (GPFLR).
3. Participants of the workshop will participate as the member of the network and support the identification of new learning sites in Indonesia to scale up and connect with The Global Partnership on Forest Landscape Restoration website.
4. To disseminate the Forest Landscape Restoration concept in Indonesia, the participants of the workshop proposed to establish an umbrella organization with the proposed name of “Indonesia Society for the National Landscape Restoration” or “Masyarakat Bentang Alam Nasional Indonesia” or MASBENI.
5. After the workshop TBI-Indonesia will sent questioner regarding basic question for landscape restoration learning site for the GPFLR learning network to all participants of the workshop.
6. Participants of the workshop have also agreed to be part of the working group on landscape restoration Indonesia. This has significantly increased the number of national working group from 27 participants to become 61 participants.
7. During the workshop the participants of the workshop have shared their knowledge and experiences concerning restoration issues useful to inspire and to add knowledge to other participants.
8. Participants of the workshop proposed and expected that the workshop of the National Working Group on Landscape Restoration be made as regular programs in the future and expanded to other stakeholders.
9. To follow up this workshop the participants have decided to assign member of small group to discuss the format of the report and develop national plan of landscape restoration.
10. Draft of report from small group will be distributed for all participants for more inputs and suggestions.
